



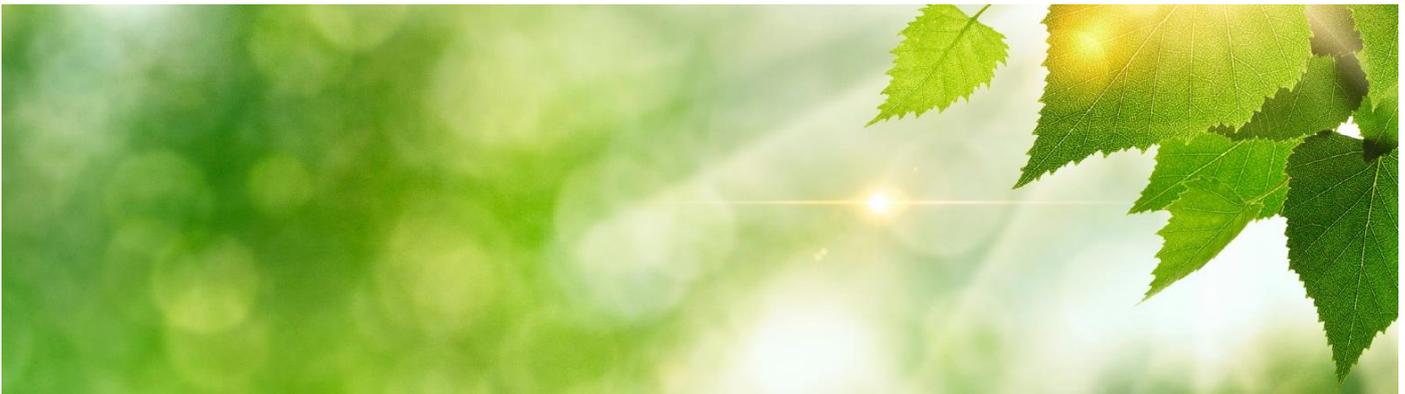

DEFRA FUTURE FARMING RESILIENCE FUND (ENGLAND ONLY)



1. INTRODUCTION

Defra launched the second phase of the Future Farming Resilience Fund (FFRF) in August 2021, to provide **free support and business advice** to current BPS applicants. This second phase of the programme is open now and will run until March 2022, with Defra allocating over £10 million of funding to 19 sector specialists including AHDB, The Prince's Countryside Fund, regional land agents and farm business consultants. The support will help BPS recipients build an understanding of the impact of reduced BPS payments on their businesses, advise how business plans need to adapt and demonstrate how to monitor business performance going forwards.

Cuts in the Basic Payment Scheme (BPS) in England start in 2021. While for most, the cuts in the first year are relatively small, the cuts will increase by 15% per year for all BPS recipients, with a minimum 50% cut in payments by 2024. BPS payments will cease completely after 2027. Farming businesses need to start making plans now for how they are going to manage this change and understanding current business performance and the impact of cuts in BPS is a good starting point.

2. WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Key information:

- The scheme is open to all current BPS applicants.
- The second phase of the scheme is open now and will run to 1 March 2022. Those interested should contact the provider **as soon as possible**. Many of the organisations have reported significant interest since their details were published on 13th July and are likely to be fully subscribed.
- There are 19 providers who cover different regions, sectors and services. The up to date list can be found [here](#) and in the table below.
- The providers are offering a range of services, including group discussion, online webinars and skills workshops. Many are also offering a bespoke farm business analysis with recommendations for improvements.
- Direct, one-to-one support can only be obtained from one provider, though applicants can attend introductory meetings and webinars to help them select a provider.
- Farms that straddle borders with Wales and Scotland are eligible to take part in this phase, as long as they have some land in England.
- A new (and final) phase of the FFRF will launch in autumn 2022 and will run until late 2024.

3. CLA ADVICE

- These services will help farmers and landowners navigate the early stages of the agricultural transition and identify key actions to build a resilient business. The CLA **strongly recommends** that members that claim BPS and are looking to adapt to future changes, should access the support under this scheme. Access to professional advice and information will help members prepare for change and highlight ways to adapt.
- Start by reviewing the list of providers and the services they are offering before accessing the one-to-one advice. Whilst all of the providers are offering an impact assessment of the cuts in BPS and most are offering a tailored farm business report, some providers are offering services such as environmental and carbon audits, which could help prepare businesses for future schemes.
- Some providers have reported high levels of interest. Members should act now or risk being faced with a limited list of providers.

4. FURTHER INFORMATION

The Defra Future Farming and Countryside Programme has a number of other schemes to support agricultural productivity, animal health and welfare, and environmental land management. These schemes are summarised in the CLA Guidance Note *Overview of Defra Agriculture Transition Schemes*. There are individual CLA Guidance notes for many of the schemes that each provide key information and advice on whether and how to apply.
